Do you want to renew or invigorate your classroom practice?

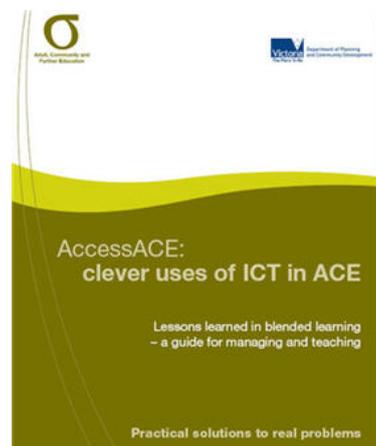
Wondering how you can use technology to expand or attract new business?

AccessACE09 is an extension of the 2007 AccessACE project in which ten ACE practitioners across Victoria participated in a blended learning research project. The research question was:

What does clever use of ICT in ACE mean and look like?

All ten organisations trialed a particular technology with a particular group of learners, in order to determine what clever use of ICT looked like in their community. Their experiences are documented in the publication entitled:

AccessACE: clever uses of ICT in ACE. Lessons learned in blended learning- a guide for managing and teaching.



The AccessACE09 project will build on the research as described in the report, through

a *Circles of Professional Practice* model.

What does this mean for me?

This project will give some 20 managers and teachers the opportunity to become a member of a Circle and investigate and build on particular aspects of the research under one of two themes:

- Classroom Practice or
- Organisational Strategy

The Circles will be managed and conducted by two organisations who participated in the 2007 project. **The Circles are supported by a total budget of \$40,000 to assist the activities of participating members.**

How will it work?

The Circles will be launched at the e-learning showcase day on the 20th March. Showcase participants will have an opportunity in the afternoon to hear about the new project, listen to facilitators and decide if and how they want to be involved. The Circles will be managed by PRACE (teaching practice) and Coonara (organisational strategy). Participants will be contacted by the managing organisations for a face-to face meeting to decide how the circle will operate and how the funding can support that.

It is anticipated that circle participants will access the knowledge and expertise generated by the participants of the 07 AccessACE project.

A great opportunity to put research into practice!
